Listen carefully and respond with questions, comments and actions during story time and in conversations with adults and peers... Begin to explain why things happen, or predict what might happen... Use vocabulary to connect my ideas in speaking and writing...

<u>Comprehension</u> – Explain what I have read, or what has been read to me. Retell simple stories. Recall facts from non-fiction books. Predict what might happen next. Use new vocabulary within my play. Key Texts: Jack and the Beanstalk / The Magic Porridge Pot / The Little Red Hen <u>Reading</u> – Phonics: Read and understand simple sentences and books matched to my phonics knowledge. Read 'red' words with increasing confidence. <u>Writing</u>: Begin to use upper case letters. Form most lower case letters correctly. Begin to write simple sentences,

starting to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops consistently. Begin to read my own sentences to check they make sense.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating a diary to monitor how out plants grow... Use materials and props to retell stories and create imaginary situations linked to what I know... Talk about my creations and begin to explain how I made it and what materials I used...

Physical Development

During formal PE lessons: Travel around space and obstacles safely; show strength and balance and co-ordination in movement; move in different ways.
